Did you know that Regal Entertainment Group, a Homework Express partner, is the largest motion picture exhibitor in the world? The company's theatre circuit, comprising Regal Cinemas, United Artists Theatres and Edwards Theatres, operates 6,273 screens in 558 locations in 40 states. So, How's That Work?

One thing that makes Homework Express unique is our ability to take calls from students live, on air.

When a student calls our studio airline, where a Homework Express crewmember screens the call. After the student tells the screener some basic information and their problem, the information is passed off to producers in the control room and teachers in the studio.

Then the call is transferred to another crewmember in the control room until the teachers are ready for the next problem. We generally handle about three phone calls simultaneously.

Teachers are also equipped with tiny wireless microphones and wireless earpieces that the producers use to talk to them without interrupting the show.
