Heather Merrit, owner of Birds in Flight Sanctuary in Howland and her two sons Anthony and Cameron Merrit, stopped by the Homework Express studio. At Birds in Flight Sanctuary they rescue and care for injured birds so they can have a second chance at flying again. With them they brought a Barred Owl, an American Kestrel, and Broad Winged Hawk. The Barred Owl is a large owl that goes by several other names such as eight hooter, rain owl, wood owl, and striped owl. The American Kestrel is a small falcon and it was formerly known in North America as the Sparrow Hawk. And the Broad Winged Hawk is a small, stocky bird that dwells in eastern forests.



Heather started Birds in Flight Sanctuary in 1992 because she wanted birds to have a safe place to stay while they were healing. She said that if you find a wild bird that is injured that you shouldn't keep at your home but instead call 1-800-Wildlife or your local police department.
